Open Responses to Township Request for Proposals for Mini –Municipal Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (Mini PROS) Plan

There were no responses to the Townships advertisement for this project. The Township Solicitor did suggest that since this is the second time this project was advertised for proposals, the Township can solicit vendors for this project.

Award of Contract to Reconstruct Township Marina

ON A MOTION by Roger Joseph and second by Lisa Edmiston the Board voted via unanimous roll call vote to award the bid for Reconstruction of the Township's Marinas at 101 Taylor Avenue and 97 Wanamaker Avenue to AP Construction, Inc. at a cost of approximately \$1,568,000. Said award will consist of reconstructing the originally permitted marinas at 97 Wanamaker, 101 Taylor Avenue, or both using existing floating docks supplemented with new hardware, decking, and piles

Relocated Tinicum Island Road - Access Gate 81 Detour

ON A MOTION by Patrick Barr and second by Roger Joseph the Board voted unanimously via roll call vote to execute an Indemnification Agreement to use the Emergency Access Gate 81 as a Detour with respect to the relocated Tinicum Island Road construction project, subject to receipt of signed agreements by the City of Philadelphia.

Relocated Tinicum Island Road Detour Agreement

ON A MOTION by Roger Joseph and second by Patrick Barr the Board voted unanimously via roll call vote to execute an Agreement, including indemnification, for the temporary detour of traffic at the intersection of the relocated Tinicum Island Road and Hog Island Road as it relates to the Tinicum Island Road construction project, subject to receipt of signed agreements by the City of Philadelphia.

Extension of Land Development Application for Alliance HD at 76 Industrial Highway

ON A MOTION by Patrick Barr and second by Lisa Edmiston the Board voted unanimously via roll call vote to accept applicant Alliance HP request to grant the Board an extension of time by which the Board must consider their "final" Land Development Application at 76 Industrial Highway. Said Land Development is to construct 3 warehouse/flex buildings consisting of 57,000 sq. ft., 45,375 sq. ft., and 50,985 sq. ft. and associated improvements. The extension shall be until September 30, 2024.

<u>Settlement of Interboro School District Tax Assessment Appeal for 51 Powhattan Avenue</u> (Folio 45-00-01383-00)

ON A MOTION by Roger Joseph and second by Patrick Barr the Board voted unanimously via roll call vote to enter into a Court Stipulation resolving the Tax Assessment Appeal of the Interboro School District for the property located at 51 Powhattan Avenue and owned by SJS Linde LP. Said Stipulation will set the annual tax assessment as follows:

2021 \$4,100,000 2022 \$4,150,000 2023 \$3,640,000 2024 \$3,487,400

The Delaware County Board of Assessment Appeals decision of December 1, 2020 fixed the assessment at \$3,688,550 effective January 1, 2021. This Stipulation has been recommended for settlement by the Interboro School District and the Property Owner.

The Township Manager reported that the Eastwick – Delaware County Leadership Group (that which is involved in the flood study for the Darby Creek) met this past week to discuss the project. There is now grant funding to construct Hesco Barriers along Cobbs Creek as a temporary measure against flooding. Funding and a final plan for a permanent solution is still being worked on. A draft of the East Coast Greenway Trail Feasibility Study has been provided by Traffic Planning and Design. A copy has been provided to the Commissioners. The project to upgrade the traffic signal system along Rt. 291 has been awarded to Miller Brothers by the City of Philadelphia. The project will begin within the next week.
